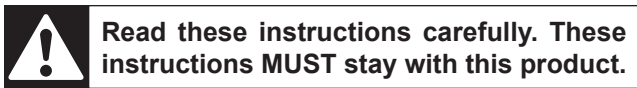

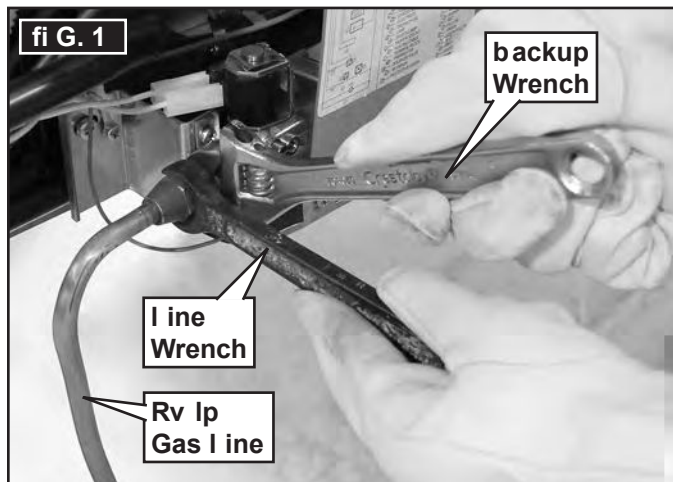

# pRoced URe

## a. installation preparation


 The air vent is installed through the upper side vent. To do this you will need to slide the refrigerator forward approximately 6 inches.

-  1. Turn refrigerator off at the control panel. Refer to RM1350 Operating Instructions.
2. **Warning!** ELECTRICAL SHOCK HAZARD. Disconnect 120 Vac power from RV. Failure to obey this warning could result in death or serious injury.
3. **NOTICE.** Disconnect the positive (+) 12 Vdc terminal from supply battery. Otherwise, damage to unit could occur.
4. **Warning!** FIRE OR EXPLOSION HAZARD. Turn off LP gas at supply tank. Failure to obey this warning could result in death or serious injury.
5. **Caution!** BURN HAZARD. Allow cooling unit piping to cool before touching. Failure to obey this caution could result in injury.
6. Remove lower vent.
7. Disconnect 120 Vac power cord from receptacle at rear of refrigerator.
8. Disconnect 12 Vdc power supply at rear of refrigerator. Tape or cap ends of wiring.
9. **NOTICE.** Use backup wrench to avoid damaging equipment. See (FIG. 1).  
Disconnect and cap LP gas line at rear of refrigerator.



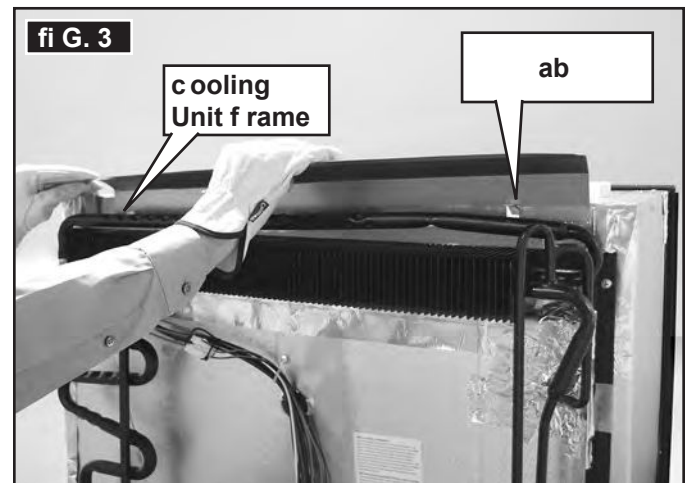
10. Remove installation screws and slide refrigerator out of alcove approximately 6 inches.
11. Remove upper vent.

## b.

-  1. Grasp air vent as shown and insert into upper vent. See (FIG. 2).

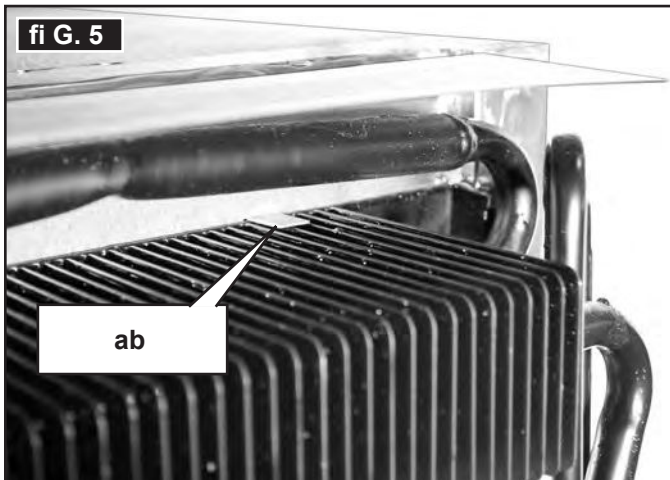


2. Slide air vent behind cooling unit frame. See (FIG. 3) & (FIG. 4). Refrigerator shown not installed for demonstration purposes.



## pRoced URe

3. When in correct position the air tabs should rest on top of the cooling unit. See (FIG. 5).



### c. Reinstall Refrigerator

1. Return refrigerator to original position and install installation screws.
2. Reconnect the 120 Vac power cord.
3. Reconnect the 12 Vdc power supply.
4. **NOTICE.** Use backup wrench technique to avoid damaging equipment. See (FIG. 1).

Reconnect the LP gas line.

5. Turn on LP gas supply.
6. **WaRninG!** FIRE OR EXPLOSION HAZARD. Never use an open flame to check for gas leaks. Failure to obey this warning could result in death or serious injury.

Check LP gas line and all fittings for leaks using an approved solution. The appearance of bubbles indicates a leak and should be repaired immediately.

7. Reinstall lower and upper vent.
8. Restore 120 Vac and 12 Vdc power.
